Sun Tolerant

Hostas

Hostas are really “shade-tolerant” plants rather than “shade” plants. Most actually grow better and faster with considerable sun, but since growers are afraid the leaf edges will become burnt, we tend to plant them in the shade. Ideal conditions are morning sun and high filtered afternoon shade. Many hostas will look fine in full sun if they receive adequate moisture. Thick-leaved hostas tend to tolerate sun conditions better than ones with thinner leaves. Some cultivars look entirely different in sun compared to shade. (See June below)

If you want to plant some hostas in mostly sunny locations, here are several to try. If you have some hostas which are not performing well where they are, do not be afraid to move them.

Quick Rule of Thumb

Hostas with fragrant flowers or yellow leaves can generally withstand more sun than those with white, blue, or green leaves.
