# Tidy & Low Maintenance

Although no plants (except for plastic ones) are 'no maintenance,' these plants tend to have the following characteristics:

1. Need little or no dead-heading
2. Are sturdy and do not usually need staking
3. Are relatively slow growing and slow spreading (and reseed never or rarely) and need division rarely.

Most of these plants still need to be cut back in fall or spring to allow for new growth.
